Administrative History

The Institute for Communal Contemplation and Dialogue (ICCD) was founded in 2002 with the mission to educate, resource, and organize people of faith to reflect, analyze, and act on the critical issues of church and society through a process of contemplation and dialogue. The Institute is under the auspices of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM) in Monroe, Michigan. The idea of the Institute stemmed from the Presidential Address that ICCD's founder Nancy

Sylvester, IHM gave at the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR) Assembly in 2000.

Nancy Sylvester, IHM has continued to serve as the organization's President and Executive Director since its founding and creates and leads various programs. She previously served as president of the Leadership Conference of Women Religious, vice president of her religious order, the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Monroe, MI (IHM), worked as a researcher, lobbyist, and National Coordinator (Executive Director) for NETWORK, and taught secondary education in Detroit, Michigan.

The Institute creates and implements a variety of programs aimed at leading individuals and organizations in addressing contemporary issues of injustice by using communal contemplation and dialogue to develop a new consciousness. Through its work, the Institute hopes to contribute to the larger movement of the transformation of consciousness so as to create new responses to the crises of our time and to cultivate a healthy Earth community. The Institute and its programs are rooted in the teachings of the Second Vatican Council, especially *Gaudium et Spes*, which calls for an understanding of the world in which we live within and outside of Christianity. It also has foundational principles on the 1972 Bishop's Synod statement on justice, which proclaimed that action on behalf of justice and the transformation of the world are constitutive elements of the preaching of the Gospel. The Institute seeks communal contemplation and dialogue as a way to address the impasses seen in contemporary society.

ICCD's first focus was a program titled "Engaging Impasse: Circles of Contemplation and Dialogue." The program was broken up into Ecclesial Circles and Societal Circles with the thought that women religious and laywomen might address experiences of impasse from differing perspectives. Each Circle met three times a year for three days at a time or once for an intensive eight-day retreat. The Circle meetings were planned by a design team made up of the following women: Jean Alvarez; Nancy Conway, CSJ; Marcia Allen, CSJ; Bette Moslander, CSJ; Dorothy Ettling, CCVI; Doris Klein, CSA; Mary McCann, IHM; Mary Jo Klick; and headed by Nancy Sylvester, IHM. Sylvester then consulted with Constance FitzGerald, OCD, a woman religious who published works on impasse. The Engaging Impasse Circles ICCD held a Learning Laboratory in 2006 which meant to extend the outreach of the Engaging Impasse project by training participants "to understand the theory and the technologies employed in the Circle process so they can integrate these learnings wherever they work." In 2008, ICCD hosted the Quantum Leap Conference, which emerged out of the Engaging Impasse project.

To kick off ICCD's second decade, it hosted the program Exploring Exercising Contemplative Power (EECP) and began to focus programming on "contemplative power". The Transformation in a Time of Uncertainty program stemmed from EECP. There was a desire by participants to continue in some way and ICCD began to offer the Contemplative Sitting Network, a daily virtual gathering in which participants gather for 20 minutes to sit in contemplation. As of 2018, the Contemplative Sitting Network had over 900 participants in 23 countries. Other notable programs the ICCD hosted

include the LCWR Special Project for Elected Leaders and Living in the Time of Impasse. More information on the programs are below.

<u>The Quantum Leap Conference</u>, held February 28-March 2, 2008, comprised of participants from the initial Engaging Impasse program. The purpose of the Quantum Leap Conference was to explore how the Engaging Impasse program created its own morphogenic field, contributing its values, attitudes, behaviors and beliefs to the larger movement for the transformation of consciousness.

The LCWR Special Project for Elected Leaders was a three-and-a-half-day program held for various presidents and provincials of congregations, some of whom had participated in the Engaging Impasse program. The purpose of this program was to communally contemplate and discuss the apostolic visitation and doctrinal assessment of the LCWR. It had several iterations for different groups between September 2009 and December 2010.

<u>Living in a Time of Impasse</u>, held March 14-20, 2010, involved personal and communal contemplative time as well as interactive processes to explore how to find meaning and hope in the current chaotic times.

There were two major programs focused on 'Exercising Contemplative Power'. One held October 26-28, 2012 and again in October 18-20, 2013 with Cynthia Bourgeault as a major presenter. These programs marked the second decade of ICCD and sought to deepen communal contemplative practice among participants so that they could ponder the differing issues and values of the world and church. This theme became the focus of other workshops and programs during the subsequent years.

<u>Transformation in a Time of Uncertainty</u> was another offshoot of Exploring Exercising Contemplative Power. Margaret Galiardi, OP, joined ICCD to help facilitate a number of these one day programs around the country. It included discussion about the uncertainty of the contemporary time and learning how to listen and speak from a contemplative heart.

The Institute published its book in 2004, *Crucible for Change: Engaging Impasse through Communal Contemplation and Dialogue*, edited by Nancy Sylvester, IHM, and Mary Jo Kick. The book shares the experiences of 12 women who participated in the first set of Circles.

Scope and Content

The Institute of Communal Contemplation and Dialogue Records consist of 7 linear feet and span the years 2000-2018.

The records primarily relate to the ICCD's programs and consist of planning documents, pamphlets, participant lists, scripts, agendas, hymns, handouts, contemplation journals, and notes reflecting on the programs. Also included are grant applications, donation resources, publications, notes and speeches by founder Nancy Sylvester, IHM. Programs covered include Engaging Impasse: Circles of Contemplation and Dialogue, Exploring Exercising Contemplative Power, Transformation in a Time of Uncertainty, Contemplative Sitting Network, Promoting the Communal Transformation of Consciousness, Enter the Chaos: Engage the Differences to Make a Difference, and others. The

records also include photographs, photo CDs, negatives, audiocassettes, mini-audiocassettes, and zip disks.

The creator of this collection sometimes used scrap paper or spare paper for notes and printing, so the verso of some pages have irrelevant or duplicative information. The collection has been reordered and grouped by program or subject. Series 2: Engaging Impasse: Circles of Contemplation and Dialogue has its own series because it comprises the bulk of the collection.

Series 1: Administrative, 2000-2012, Box 1-2, and 15

This series contains materials relating to the early formation of ICCD and its first program, Engaging Impasse: Circles of Contemplation and Dialogue. It also includes materials related to fundraising, donations, and grants. Two folders with sensitive information have [RESTRICTED] written on them. They are listed intellectually with similar folders but have been move to the last letter-sized Hollinger box in the collection, which notes restricted items. For access to these folders, consult the archivist.

Series 2: Engaging Impasse: Circles of Contemplation and Dialogue, 2000-2013, undated, Boxes 2-12

This series contains materials relating to the foundational program of ICCD. This was a large program that spanned over a decade and had dozens of groups that met 3 times a year. Because of this, many folders contain the same type of materials such as participant lists, agendas, handwritten notes from the founder, email correspondence, mailed correspondence, etc. Instead of listing all contents for folder titles, larger topics were chosen to represent all materials in the folder. Original order was maintained as much as possible, but those with similar subject matter or titles were identified and placed together. Series 4 holds media that corresponds to various Engaging Impasse Gatherings and Circle meetings.

Series 3: Subsequent Programs, 2007-2016, Box 13

This series contains materials relating to subsequent programs hosted by ICCD including the Quantum Leap Conference, the LCWR Special Project for Elected Leaders, Living in the Time of Impasse (LITI), Exploring Exercising Contemplative Power, and Transformation in a Time of Uncertainty (TITU). Materials include agendas, notes, participant lists, correspondence, surveys, evaluations, program handouts, biographies of participants, and more. Series 4 holds media that corresponds to the Quantum Leap Conference.

Series 4: Audiovisual Materials, 2002-2008, undated, Boxes 14-20

This series contains audiovisual materials relating to the various ICCD programs and planning sessions. Materials include 151 audiocassettes, 4 mini-audiocassettes, photographs, 11 CDs, and 3 zip disks. Audiocassettes have been ordered according to the programs and dates on their labels. Not all audiocassettes are labeled, so they are kept next to audiocassettes from the original order.

Subseries 4.1: Photographs, 2002-2007, undated, Box 14 includes photographs, negatives, and CDs of Engaging Impasse Circle meetings. The CDs in this subseries were found in envelopes with photographs and negatives and, therefore, were kept together.

Subseries 4.2: CDs, 2003-2008, Boxes 14-15 includes mostly digital photographs from the Engaging Impasse Circle meetings and the Quantum Leap Conference. It also includes word

documents, a guided program by Pema Chödrön, and the cover art for *Crucible for Change* (a book put out by ICCD in 2004 edited by Nancy Sylvester, IHM and Mary Jo Klick).

Subseries 4.3 Zip Disks, 2004, Box 15 includes two zip disks of documents from the creator's computer and one blank zip disk.

Subseries 4.4: Audiocassettes, 2002-2006, Boxes 16-19 includes 151 audiocassettes relating to the Engaging Impasse Circle meetings and 4 mini-audiocassettes from the Quantum Leap Conference. The Quantum Leap mini-audiocassettes came with a handwritten description of the audiocassettes' contents, which has been separated and foldered in Box 15. The audiocassettes are labeled by group and date, but the tapes themselves sometimes have more information written on them such as "What is Dawning," "What is Shifting," "Things That Scare You," "The Five Whys," and more. These are common topics in the Engaging Impasse meetings, and Series 2 contains journal handouts for these topics as well. The tapes have been labeled based on the groups (Circles, Ecclesial, and Societal) that met and have the dates the audiocassettes were created immediately following in M/D/YR format.

Subseries 4.5: Miscellaneous, undated, Box 20 includes pieces of broken clay, and two small candles used during the Engaging Impasse Circle meetings. One of the candles, a small blue glass votive with a petroglyph symbol, was given as a gift to the participants at the conclusion of the three sessions. It was a reminder of the glass bowl which had the petroglyph engraved on it used as the center of the ritual space throughout the sessions and was referred to as "She Who Watches".
