Biographical History

Eileen Ryan (b. January 11, 1957) is a Chicago-based multi-media and photographic artist. She was a member of the Artemisia Gallery from 1990-1993, and had several installations at the gallery during that time. Ryan earned her MFA from the Art Institute of Chicago in 1996. In 1997, she was also affiliated with the ARC Gallery, and was considered by them to be a "2nd generation" electronic media artist, who adopted digital technologies for artistic purposes. Ryan was involved with Chicago's Near Northwest Arts Council, and helped coordinate FACE THE STREET, a public art event held in Wicker Park. Ryan has received grants from the City of Chicago Department of Public Affairs, the Illinois Arts Council Access Program, Kodak, Partners if the Americas and the City Arts Program of the City of Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs.

Scope and Content

The records in this collection are comprised mainly of material from various art exhibits that Eileen Ryan was a part of or exhibits of her own. There is a booklet that documents her membership at the Artemisia Gallery, and a newspaper clipping from *Chicago Artists' News* that contains an interview with artist Barry Blinderman. There is audiovisual material in this collection as well. Contents include black and white photographs of installations by Eileen Ryan, color slides of installations, transparencies used in exhibitions, a videocassette used in Ryan's installation *Oblique*, a beta videocassette used in an installation, and 2 cassette tapes that contain an episode of NPR's *Morning Edition* that has a memoriam to artist Elizabeth "Grandma" Layton. The materials are arranged alphabetically.

Series 1: Professional, 1991-1997, n.d., Box 1

Contains material related to Ryan's participation in the Artemisia Gallery. Also contains promotional material from several of exhibitions that Ryan was a part of, including: The 40th Arts Festival of Atlanta, *Convergence*, *Electronic Immersions*, **FACE THE STREET**, *Oblique*, and *Zone*. There is a miscellaneous folder that contains newspaper clippings.

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Series 2: Audiovisual, 1991-1996, n.d., Box 2

Contains a videocassette used in Ryan's installation *Oblique*, a beta videocassette from an unknown installation, 2 cassette tapes of an episode of NPR's *Morning Edition* featuring a memoriam of artist Elizabeth "Grandma" Layton, 8"x10" black and white photographs of Ryan's installations, 5"x7" black and white photographs from an exhibition, 3"x5" color transparencies used in installations, and slides detailing several of Ryan's installations.
