Organization History

The papers from the Greater Chicago Chapter of the U.S. Committee for UNIFEM (The United Nations Development Fund for Women) span from 1990 to 2001, when the chapter was dissolved. The Greater Chicago Chapter (called here the Chicago Chapter) began in 1989 as a volunteer organization that worked to support projects in developing nations of the world through affiliation with UNIFEM. The chapter mission statement explains that the chapter was formed to build awareness in the Chicago community of the key role women play in reaching development goals, to raise funds to support UNIFEM activities, to provide speakers to Chicago area organizations and schools, and to work with other local, national and international organizations which share our goals for women. The basic concern of the organization was to support and strive for the civil and political rights of women and recognition of women as equal partners in society.

UNIFEM was created in 1976 by the UN General Assembly as the Volunteer Fund for the UN Decade For Women. Renamed in 1985, it works in autonomous association with the UN Development Program. Based in New York, UNIFEM has regional programs in Asia and the Pacific, western Asia, Africa and Latin America and the Caribbean. UNIFEM'S program areas focus on women's economic and political empowerment.

Members of the Chicago Chapter paid annual dues of which part was sent to UNIFEM-USA. Office space was secured. The chapter issued periodic newsletters and invitations to a wide variety of programs, speakers and events throughout the years. Often the chapter sponsored special events such as the International Women's Day and programs

such as AFWIC Umbrella Program—African Women in Crisis. Also the chapter planned fund raising projects such a 1992 cook book project and a 1999 quilt project.

The chapter membership numbers were usually about thirty to thirty-five and there was an active membership committee. In 2001 the chapter called a special meeting in February to discuss dissolving the chapter. As of March 31, 2001 the chapter was officially dissolved. Nihal Hassan was president at the time.

The papers also contain material related to UNIFEM-USA. Reports indicate that it developed from the First Women's Conference in Mexico in 1975. In 1976 Pat Kutar is credited with the beginning of UMIFEM-USA. The UNIFEM-USA papers contain extensive correspondence from its president to the twenty chapters. Membership dues information and by-laws revision details are included. There are reports of annual meetings along with the 1994 UNIFEM-USA Handbook. Information on CEDAW is also included.

CEDAW-The Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women was adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1979. It became an autonomous organization within the UN in 1985. There are files on CEDAW activities in the Chicago area and correspondence with Chicago chapter members. In 1999 CEDAW members made an effort to have the city of Chicago adopt the Convention so that its provisions would set goals and standards of conduct for all in Chicago in promoting equality for women in all aspects of their lives. There is a copy of the Resolution prepared by CEDAW in the papers.

The papers include a document, "WOMEN and the UN 1945-1995," which presents a helpful overview of UNIFEM. There is also a helpful fact sheet on the creation of UNIFEM and its place in the UN. UNIFEM's role of advocating for women in developing nations is basic to its activities. The desires of the Chicago chapter was to always support and assist with funds and education this major work of UNIFEM through UNIFEM-USA.

Scope & Content

The papers of the Greater Chicago Chapter of UNIFEM-USA span the years 1990 to 2001 and document the organization and activities of the chapter. Included are annual statements of the purpose and goals .In addition there is extensive material on UNIFEM-USA of which the Chicago Chapter was a dues paying member. The Chicago Chapter papers contain organizational history, chapter brochures, the work of committees and extensive Board of Directors material. Also there are reports of chapter activities and sponsored events. The UNIFEM-USA material contains correspondence, membership information, by-law revisions and annual meeting reports.

This series contains Chicago chapter brochures, membership information, and agendas and minutes of the Board of Directors' meetings. There are also business and committee reports. This series also contains materials on the organization of UNIFEM/USA.

This series contains information on the many programs, events, and conference in which UNIFEM was involved. It also contains information on CEDAW (Convention on the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination Against Women).
