Administrative History

Catherine Anna Louise Jarrott was born in Los Angeles, California on August 6, 1925. She started her academic career after attending Hollywood High School at Los Angeles City College, earning her A.A. degree in 1945. Catherine received her Bachelor's degree in English, summa cum laude, at the University of California in Los Angeles in 1947, before receiving her M.A. and Ph.D. from Stanford University in English in 1949 and 1954, respectively. Dr. Jarrott continued her post-graduate education at Saint Louis University starting in 1952. She then accepted a post at Loyola University Chicago in 1963, where she stayed until her death in 1985.

During her career, Professor Jarrott was honored as a Fulbright Scholar for teaching English in the Netherlands in 1960 and was fluent in Latin, Dutch, French and German. She became an authority on Erasmus, Renaissance Humanist Literature, Chaucer, Shakespeare, and theological works. Her particular interest was John Colet's interpretation on I Corinthians and Romans. Dr. Jarrott published several articles and received much respect for her work. Her collaboration with scholar Bernard O'Kelly lead to the publication of John Colet's Commentary of I Corinthians, a work that Jarrott and O'Kelly spent several years trying to get published despite many trials. She was promoted to associate professor at Loyola and eventually became the director of the undergraduate English program. Besides her accomplishments at Loyola University, Dr. Jarrott was president of her local chapter of the American Association of University Professors, a member of the Renaissance Seminar of the University of Chicago, and many other professional organizations.

Scope and Content

The Catherine Jarrott, Ph.D., papers consists of 5.5 linear feet spanning the years 1944-1984 (bulk 1960-1980), and includes personal keepsakes, correspondence, drafts, published articles, papers and notes from Jarrott's student career, instructor notes for coursework, note cards, course syllabi and exams, student papers, academic articles and copies of relevant works, and research notebooks. Academic & research articles include John Colet's: *Celestial Hierarchy, An Exposition of St. Paul's First Epistle to the Corinthians, Letters to Radulphus, On the Ecclesiastical Hierarchy, and A Treatise on the Sacraments of the Church*. Language is predominantly English but there are exceptions: Dutch articles that Professor Jarrott translated; letters from the Karayiannis family that Professor Jarrott sponsored through the Save the Children Federation in Greek; note cards and some research notes in Latin and French.
