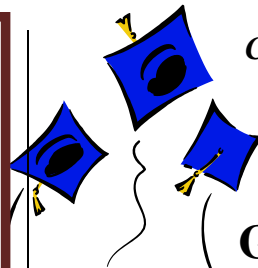

WORKING WITH OUR INNER POLARITIES: THE ENNEAGRAM PERSPECTIVE

Whenever we identify with idealized aspects of our personality (me), we tend to dis-identify with our opposite attributes (not-me). For example, if we think of ourselves as being loving and kind, then we don’t want to be seen as selfish and cruel. To avoid these unacceptable parts of ourselves, we put them in the basement (our unconscious) where we can forget about them. This is called repression. Or, we can go further and throw out our garbage, which is called projection.

Re-owning our disavowed parts and integrating our inner polarities leads to inner wholeness and an enriched sense of self, an increase in energy, and undistorted connections with others vs. a one-dimensional personality with disordered energy, internal conflicts and exasperating relationships.

Through illustrations, exercises, and dialogue, we will identify each Enneagram style’s persona, shadow, defenses, and path to integration. In other words we’ll learn how to re-label, re-own, and re-use all of ourselves.
