While faith-based organizing adapts a secular model created by Saul Alinsky (the US Father of Community Organizing), Faith-rooted organizing builds on the work of Gandhi, the civil rights movement and liberation theologies to create an organizing model shaped and guided in all ways by our faith and designed to enable people of faith to contribute our unique gifts to the broader movement for justice. Developed by CLUE-CA, faith-rooted organizing is now being taught across the US. It is particularly useful for organizing in conservative faith communities.
