GREETINGS from the DEAN

More than 25 years ago, the late Dr. Charles O'Reilly (see memorial article on pg. 8) began forging international social work partnerships to expand our school's educational experiences. Over recent years, building on Dean O'Reilly's global spirit, we successfully expanded and solidified international alliances with several universities across the world.

Earlier this summer, Dr. Daniel Lee and I spent three weeks in Asia visiting universities in Korea, Japan, Hong Kong, and other Chinese cities. During our visit, we established agreements with eight higher education institutions to join in a collaborative effort at the University's Beijing Center. These joint ventures were the result of Dr. Lee's tireless

efforts to establish strong relationships among Asian faculty and administrators.

In July, Dr. James Marley, associate dean, and I negotiated agreements with six Italian universities to offer a co-sponsored course next year at the



John Felice Rome Center. The focus will be immigration issues confronting both Italy and the United States. Our hope is to have an annual co-sponsored course that will include Italian and U.S. students/alumni and faculty.

All of these international partnerships will be part of the school's Institute for Migration and Global Studies and Practice. This institute is among three which our school is developing. The work of our institute directors—Drs. Maria Vidal de Haymes, Marcia Spira, and Katherine Tyson-McCrea—is featured within this issue.

Institutes leverage research, teaching strengths

Interdisciplinary institutes, a University strategic priority, enrich faculty collaboration while boosting the national and international impact of Loyola research, teaching, and service in key topics. The School of Social Work recently created three institutes that house multidisciplinary faculty and student research, student assistantships, and community organization collaborations.

Migration and Global Studies and Practice

The most developed of the three new institutes is the Institute for Migration and Global Studies and Practice, directed by Maria Vidal de Haymes, PhD. "The impact of globalization and migration is producing challenges that cross national borders," says Vidal de Haymes, noting that these migration-related issues include persistent or periodic ruptures in families and social support, exposure to violence and exploitation, poverty and economic insecurity, vulnerabilities related to legal status, and cultural and linguistic isolation.

Many established initiatives provide a solid framework for the institute's future efforts. Recent and ongoing projects include:

- A new migration studies subspecialization and certificate program
- Transnational field placement with Jesuit Migrant Service-Mexico and Iberoamericana University in Mexico
- A training curriculum for Illinois Department of Children and Family Services employees who work with Latino immigrant families
- A forum on the emerging impact of migration on child welfare services that includes both the U.S. and countries of origin, resulting in a national migrational and child welfare network
- A transnational study on the impact of faith and the Catholic church on the well-being of Mexican migrant families
- A multinational study on immigrant integration in Europe and North America

Advanced Innovations in Social Work Practice and Research

The Institute for Advanced Innovations in Social Work Practice and Research will provide support for Loyola-based faculty, students, and postdoctoral fellows in discovering innovative practice models that social workers and allied practitioners can implement in a variety of practice and research areas such as family violence, socially traumatized populations, and school settings.

The institute will support projects that include one or more innovations:

- A problem that has not been addressed before or a new perspective or application to a continuing problem
- A new partnership or collaborative process
- Unique research design and methods
- An innovative product

"These innovations characteristically involve partnerships between University-based scholars and community members, community social service staff, and other service professionals, and often include alliances across disciplines, culture, and countries," explains Katherine Tyson-McCrea, one of the lead research faculty members of the institute.

Intergenerational Studies and Practice

As the demographic of age shifts dramatically in the U.S., the Institute of Intergenerational Studies and Practice supports the multiple efforts of Loyola faculty in social work, law, psychology, nursing, sociology, and medicine in the area of intergenerational families and older adults.

Directed by Marcia Spira, PhD, "the institute supports study, research, training, and partnership with other agencies and universities on the cultural and religious affiliation, family styles, economic conditions, and health challenges of intergenerational families," Spira says. Goals include supporting grant writing activities, creating continuing education programs that will lead to a certificate in intergenerational families, providing consultation services for community agencies, offering student internships, expanding cross-departmental collaboration, and building a volunteer core for community projects and needs assessment.

SUPPORTING OUR SCHOOL

Loyola's School of Social Work to receive its first endowed professorship

The SSW recently received a tremendous boost that will forever provide income for our faculty. Because of the forward thinking of Dr. and Mrs. Lucian Matusak (Lucian BS '43, MD '43) more than 10 years ago to establish a charitable remainder unitrust in Lucian's estate, our school officially received their gift this past July to establish our first endowed professorship.

Beginning fall 2009, the SSW will receive approximately \$22,000 a year from the Lucian and Carol Welch Matusak Endowed Professorship. This much-needed additional income will be used to enhance the work of the faculty directors of our newly established institutes in a three-year rotation, starting with Dr. Maria Vidal de Haymes of our Global and Migration Studies Institute.

Mrs. Matusak, a social worker, reflected, “My husband and I shared a commitment to support education, and specifically education in our respective fields (medicine and social work). I am delighted that the SSW's institutes will be receiving financial support from this endowed professorship.”

An endowed professorship is a fund invested in the

University's general endowment, with the intention to provide income to specifically sustain in perpetuity faculty salaries or research/programmatic initiatives. The principal of the fund is never spent; however, annual income provides support for the designated faculty initiatives.

Expanding Loyola's contribution to the social work profession

In fall 2008, we welcomed two new faculty members. We are grateful for the expertise they bring to our students and the social work community.

Lynn Boyle, MSW, CADC, clinical instructor, received her undergraduate degree from the University of Michigan and her MSW from the Jane Addams College of Social Work-University of Illinois at Chicago. She has more than two decades of clinical, administrative, and teaching experience focusing on addiction and HIV/AIDS. Boyle also will be working to establish a Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor training program within the School of Social Work (in collaboration with the Illinois Alcoholism and Other Drug Abuse Professional Counselor Certification Association).

Caleb Kim, PhD, MSW, joined the School of Social Work as director of the MSW program. He received his PhD from the School of Social Service Administration, University of Chicago, and his MSW degree from Norfolk State University in Virginia. He previously was chair and director of the BSW program at the University of St. Francis in Joliet, a visiting professor at the University of Chicago, and a faculty member for nine years at Yonsei University in Korea. His current research interests are school social work, child welfare, and immigration issues.

Shirley R. Simon, MSW, LCSW, assistant professor, is leading a project, "Connecting Students and Professional Associations," which brought Loyola students together with the Association for the Advancement of Social Work with Groups (AASWG) via participation in the International Symposium in Cologne, Germany, in June. Nine students attended and five students presented at the Symposium.

This is the fourth year that Simon has taken students to the Symposium. Simon also teaches a course on professional development, and has developed an SSW course module on the role of professional associations that was supported by a Loyola EVOKE (Encouraging Vocation Through Knowledge and Experience) incentive grant.

SSW faculty honored

Phil Young P. Hong, PhD

Dr. Hong, assistant professor, received the Course-Based Philanthropy (CBP) award from Loyola's Center for Urban Research and Learning (CURL) to integrate a philanthropy component (\$3,000) into the Policies and Strategies for Community Interventions (SOWK 509) course.

He received a 2008 CURL Faculty Fellowship for his proposed study, "Developing a Scale of Employment Hope for Community-Based Workforce Development," and a 2008 Rising Star Travel Award from PolicyLink to attend the Third National Summit on Equitable Development, Social Justice, and Smart Growth in March.

Hong also has been appointed a member of the CSWE Council on External Relations for a term through 2011. The Council is designed to work in concert with the Commission on Global Social Work Education, with specific interface with other global organizations.

Alan J. Levy, DSW, LSCW

Dr. Levy, associate professor, is a national board member of the Clinical Social Work Association and has been nominated for membership in the National Academy of Practice (NAP), which advises the federal government on health care issues and lends the expertise of its members to government and other national organizations. NAP includes 10 health professions; the membership is limited to 150 for each profession.

He received the 2007 Distinguished Career Award, given to outstanding alumni with at least 25 years post-graduation experience from the Simmons College School of Social Work.

Levy has received national and international recognition for papers and articles on the therapeutic action of play in psychoanalytic treatment of children, neurobiological aspects of play in child psychoanalytic therapy, and how play therapy contributes to the treatment of children with Asperger Syndrome and High-Functioning Autism.

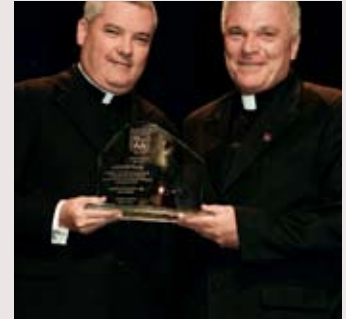
