ENSURING A FUTURE FOR SCIENCE



The Junior Science and Humanities Symposium, sponsored by the US Army/Navy/Air Force and Loyola University Chicago is introducing an e-mentoring program for students preparing to compete in the 2012 Chicago Regional JSHS. Students will be able to use faculty members at Loyola University Chicago and other local universities as resources to provide help with their research projects. Special emphasis will be placed on experimental design and statistical analysis, but students with questions about any aspect of their projects are welcome to participate. Students wishing to connect with an e-mentor can contact the Chicago Regional JSHS office and we will attempt to pair students with a mentor with the required expertise.



Students seeking an e-mentor should have some preliminary background information for their mentor.

- "What question am I trying to answer?" (i.e., what is the purpose of my investigation?)
- "What hypothesis am I testing?"
- "What methods and/or techniques do I plan to use to test my hypothesis?"

The e-mentoring program is open to all high schools students who are considering presenting a paper at the Chicago Regional Junior Science and Humanities Symposium, March 31, 2012 at Loyola University Chicago. Inquiries should be sent to:
