Loyola's Department of Fine and Performing Arts combines the disciplines of Dance, Music, Theatre, and Visual Arts and provides quality arts education to students. This new alignment of creative energies, which helps foster interdisciplinary collaboration, combined with the renovation of two buildings on the Lake Shore Campus, has inspired an artistic renaissance at Loyola. This collaboration has also inspired innovative public programming that engages several varieties of art and artist.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to all undergrad and grad students in the greater Chicagoland area. All work must be original and have been completed within the last two years.

MEDIA AND SPECIFICATIONS

All media are eligible, including drawing, painting, printmaking, photography, digital, video, sculpture, jewelry, fashion, ceramics, kitsch, mixed media and collage.

Entries must be smaller than 6ft x 6ft.

When applying for consideration, please send, by mail, digital images on a CD or DVD. Images must be in a .jpg, .psd, or .pdf format with a maximum of 1800 pixels in height or width. Format the file name as follows: "LastName_Title.jpg". If you wish to have your CD / DVD returned to you, include a self-addressed stamped envelope (SASE). Send your completed entry form and CD/DVD to the address listed below. Images not corresponding to the formatting sizes may not be accepted.

ENTRY FEE

A non-refundable entry fee of \$10 per piece will be charged to each participant to be turned in with the completed call for artists form. Make checks or money orders payable to: **Loyola University Chicago**

DELIVERY OF ACCEPTED ARTWORK

Please use sturdy, reusable containers suitable for shipping artwork. **No shipped artwork will be returned without pre-paid postage.** Artwork will only be held for 30 days after the close of the exhibition.

ENTRY LABELS

All accepted work must be labeled. The label must include the following information: name, address, phone, email, title, date, media, dimension, and value.

Please copy and attach the provided label form to the upper right back side of two-dimensional works, or include it in a visible location for sculpture or other three-dimensional media.

EXHIBITION

The exhibition dates are March 27 – April 17, 2009. All artwork must remain in the Crown Center Gallery until the close of the exhibition.

LIABILITY

All reasonable effort and care will be given for the works while in the care of Loyola University Chicago. Limited insurance for the replacement of materials is provided in the event of loss or damage of work while on display in the Crown Center Gallery.

SALES AND REPRODUCTION

The Crown Center Gallery does not charge a commission for the sale of artwork. Inquiries are directed to the artist. Entrants agree to allow reproduction of accepted works as necessary for publication/marketing purposes.
