TO WHAT AND TO WHOM THIS SHEET PERTAINS

Any person involved in the production, construction or painting

RISKS OR CONSEQUENCES

Central nervous system disruption, neurological damage, respiratory problems

BEST PRACTICES, RULES & PROCEDURES

- When using plastics and other exotic materials wear a respirator or mask and only assemble or glue parts in the spray booth area with the fan on. Not only does the fan in the booth pull fumes away from the work but a make-up air unit will engage as well providing fresh air to the room.
- Never spray paint or lacquers in any place but the spray booth.
- Refer to the SAFETY INFORMATION SHEETS: TOOLS AND MACHINERY, PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND PROPER CLOTHING, WORKING WITH ELECTRICITY
- Read all MSDS safety sheets for chemicals or paints you intend to use. MSDS sheets are located in the paint area shelf and on line at <http://www.hz.genium.com/> login: loyola and password: msdslibrary
