Loyola University Latino Alumni Board (LULAB) wishes to recognize a currently enrolled Loyola University Chicago undergraduate student with an academic scholarship. The academic award(s) is granted on the basis of each candidate's academic accomplishments as well as service to the Loyola community and/or the local Latino community. The scholarship is awarded without regard to financial need. The award is a minimum of \$1,000 and is restricted to tuition. The LULAB Scholarship is applicable toward the 2008–2009 academic year. Recipients will be notified in April 2008 and will also be announced at the 2008 Eighth Annual LULAB Fundraiser Reception on April 11 at the Water Tower Campus. Attendance at the reception is mandatory for scholarship recipients. All recipients must commit to assisting LULAB in planning and executing future events. Non-compliance may affect continued scholarship eligibility.

Undergraduate students must have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average and have completed a minimum of three semesters at any of the following Loyola campuses: Lake Shore (including St. Joseph's Seminary), Water Tower or Rome Center.

This scholarship is named in memory of Rick Guerrero, who served as president of Loyola's Latino American Student Association (LASO) while he was an undergraduate at Loyola. In 1992, he passed away unexpectedly while playing football with friends at Loyola Park near the Lake Shore Campus.

- A one-page signed letter of recommendation from a Loyola faculty member
- A sealed official school transcript. Internet or computer-generated copies are not acceptable. Official transcripts may be requested free of charge through LOCUS.

Applicants must give the LULAB Committee access to all Loyola financial aid information in order to determine scholarship eligibility.

Please feel free to submit any additional information to assist the scholarship committee in reviewing your information. Additional information is welcome but not required.
