

Members who will be enrolled in the PPO plan as of 1/1/2011 can determine estimated drug costs by following the instructions below:

- A member should review the PPO Rx coverage level by referencing the Loyola handouts. (Below is an overview of benefits)

- \$100 Individual Rx deductible/ \$3000 Individual out-of-pocket maximum
- \$200 Family Rx deductible/\$6000 Family out-of-pocket maximum

Generic Drugs covered at 90% (member pays 10%) *deductible does not apply to generic drugs.*

Formulary Brand/Non Formulary Brand drugs are covered at 75% (member pays 25%)

Maximum per prescription: The member is responsible to pay the Generic and Brand coinsurance amount up to a maximum of \$200 per prescription at retail and \$400 per prescription at mail order.

-Deductibles and Out-of-Pocket (OPX) dollars are separate from the medical deductible and OPX. Rx Deductible does not apply to Rx OPX.

- Walgreen's Mail order is not available under the PPO. Any HMO member using Walgreen's Mail order today will need to submit a new Rx for mail to Prime Therapeutics.

- Any existing mail order prescriptions through Prime will carry over but process under the new benefit level as of 1/1/2011.

- 90 day supply is available at retail pharmacies.

-Diabetic supplies (test strips, lancets etc...) and Insulin/syringes will be covered at the generic benefit level. Member will pay 10%.

Visit the Prime website at www.myrxhealth.com to determine estimated Rx costs:

- No need to log in (an HMO member will not be enrolled into the PPO plan until 1/1/2011 and if they log in the HMO benefits will be calculated). Click the "find drugs and estimates" on the left side of the screen.
- Select a health plan and choose BCBSIL and elect "no" when asked if you are a Medicare part D member.
- Search for drugs and enter the dosage.
- The screen will display the estimated* cost at 30 day supply at retail and 90 day at Prime Mail.
- Take the cost that is displayed and determine the cost based on Loyola Benefits as noted above.

*The retail prices displayed represent estimated prices for your prescription drugs at a common retail pharmacy. Prices are retail pharmacy estimates only and are based on typical contracted prices paid to pharmacies. Prices do not include federal, state, or local taxes or additional fees. The actual price you pay is determined by your benefit plan, and will be calculated at your pharmacy at the time of purchase.
