

**FINANCIAL ESTIMATE FOR THE FIRST YEAR AT
THE INSTITUTE OF PASTORAL STUDIES (FULL-TIME, INTERNATIONAL)**

<u>Tuition:</u>	U.S. \$14,280	Tuition for 2005-2006 is \$1,785 per 3-hour graduate course.85 8 courses (including summer) <u>Optional Formation Programs</u> Spiritual Direction @ \$245 per semester Pastoral Counseling @ \$455 per semester <u>Required 0 Credit Hour Classes:</u> For MDiv: PRG @ \$245 per semester For MAPC: Identity-Integration @ \$285 per semester MA Thesis/Project @ \$485 per semester Crisis Intervention @ \$195 (1 semester only)

<u>Books</u>	1280	Students find that \$80 per class is a minimum estimate
<u>Computer</u>	1300	Notebook/desk top: Printer/toner
<u>Xeroxing</u>	80	Both for yourself and for classes, you will need things copied
<u>Stationery</u>	150	Notebooks, typing paper, cards, etc. (personal and academic)
<u>Postage</u>	150	Depending on how much you write home, and what you send back. Books by surface mail could be a major expense
<u>Luggage Freight</u>	1000	Consider the cost of getting your things here, plus the additional things you will be taking home. -Overseas Return: \$1000 -Road travel: \$900 (i.e. Canada, Mexico)
<u>Hospitalization</u>	1650	You must show proof of adequate coverage on your own policy, or get hospitalization insurance through the University. This figure is based on 1 year insurance at \$1400 + other medical needs and medicines
<u>Room</u>	9000	Monthly rent of \$580 - \$750 + utilities as an average. If you share a room or live in a convent or rectory, this would be less
<u>Setting Up</u>	1000	Even in a "furnished" apartment, you will need pots, pans, dishes, cutlery, linens, towels, pillows, blankets, TV. Stereo, iron/board, vacuum cleaner, etc.
<u>Telephone</u>	1090	Cost of phone; installation \$150, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Local cell phone: \$700 annual (<i>estimate</i>) • Overseas Prepaid Card@ \$4.00 = \$240 annual (estimate.)
<u>Laundry</u>	175	Coin-operated machines may cost up to \$2.50 per load
<u>Food</u>	3600	Allows \$300 monthly for food, which is not extravagant
<u>Supplies</u>	150	Cleaning and paper supplies beyond food
<u>Entertainment</u>	1000	You may wish to allow \$80 per month for theater, movies, music, an occasional dinner out
<u>Halas Sport Center</u>	225	\$180 Annual membership to Lake Shore Campus facility which entitles you to swimming, racquetball, weights, basketball, etc.
<u>Local Travel</u>	400+	Includes the cost of unlimited bus/L pass of \$88 for full-time students during each semester. Also, include extra for summer travel within the city.
<u>Winter Clothing</u>	700	If your climate does not have the winter temperature Chicago does, you will need a warm coats, hat, scarf, gloves and boots
<u>Miscellaneous</u>	500	For whatever we have forgotten, which will be absolutely essential if you do not allow for it.
<u>TOTAL</u>	\$38,766.	Minimum amount needed for tuition and living expenses

NOTE: This is average estimated expenses that may or may not be incurred annually.
