November 14, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., IPS Office

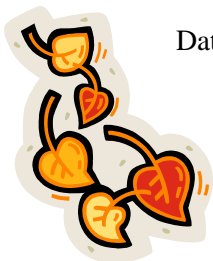
In the counseling setting, dreamwork can provide a personalized exploration of a client's inner and outer lives.
