To be eligible for this scholarship, the applicant must meet the following criteria: (i) be a law student attending one of the law schools in Illinois and (ii) be a person of color or a person whose background or experience would otherwise contribute to the diversity of the legal profession. In selecting each recipient of the scholarship, KABA will be evaluating a number of factors including, but not limited to, the applicant’s (i) commitment to diversity, (ii) commitment to the Korean community, (iii) commitment to public interest legal work, (iv) academic excellence or growth, (v) financial need, (vi) career aspirations, and any other relevant factors. No one factor is required or dispositive.

If you meet the above criteria, I hope that you will complete the application found in this packet or pass along the application to someone you believe would qualify.

The winners of the scholarships will be announced at KABA’s 2008 Annual Banquet to be held on Thursday, May 15, 2008 at the Art Institute of Chicago (Chicago Stock Exchange Trading Room). Please contact us if you need additional information regarding the Annual Banquet.
