Get Certified!

The [Student Leadership Certificate Program](#) is a new program open to all Loyola University Chicago students who are interested in enhancing their leadership capabilities. The program is comprised of a series of workshops aimed at fostering a set of learning outcomes modeled after the Social Change Model of Leadership.

Students may choose to participate in a just a few workshops for fun or may also complete the requirements to receive a certificate. Students who complete 7 workshops--including 2 core workshops and at least 1 workshop from each of the three learning outcome categories--and a culminating project by the time they graduate from Loyola will earn a Leadership Certificate. Registration is not required for attendance at any of the workshops.

The first workshop will be held on *Tuesday, September 1st* at 7pm in the CFSU Hague Conference Room. This workshop will concentrate on LGBTQ leadership and ally development.

Alternative Break Immersions

Ministry is offering two urban immersions for first-year students in the early fall. The Urban Immersion is a 48-hour immersion experience that takes first-year students into different parts of Chicago to learn about social issues affecting our city and listen to the hopes and struggles of people and communities in various local neighborhoods.

The dates of the urban immersions are *August 28-30 and September 11-13*. The cost to participate is \$50 and First-Year students (i.e. freshmen) can apply online at www.luc.edu/ministry

Ministry will also offer a winter break immersion to Cuernavaca, Mexico with the Cuernavaca Center for Intercultural Dialogue on Development. The deadline to apply for participation in this January 8-17 international immersion is September 18.

Ministry's Alternative Break Immersion program are open to undergraduate students. Applications will be accepted online through October 16.
