Aaron Feinstein currently serves as a Special Assistant with the Chicago Inspector General's Office (IGO), where he created its Program and Policy Review unit. This section conducts independent, objective, nonpartisan research on the economy, efficiency, and effectiveness of city programs. This includes analyzing the performance of city programs and comparing the costs and benefits of city services. While with the IGO, Mr. Feinstein has authored analyses of Chicago's long-term lease of its parking meters, the city's affirmative action government contracting program, the efficiency of City truck drivers, and two reports outlining steps the city could take to reduce its budget deficit. Prior to joining the IGO, Mr. Feinstein served as a Finance Analyst for the Speaker of the New York City Council, and assisted in authoring an overhaul of the New York City budget to make it more transparent and performance based. Mr. Feinstein has a Master of Public Administration and a B.A. from New York University.
