The mission of Active Transportation Alliance is to make bicycling, walking, and public transit so safe, convenient, and fun that Chicago will see a significant shift from environmentally harmful, sedentary travel to clean, active travel. They advocate for transportation that encourages and promotes safety, physical activity, health, recreation, social interaction, equity, environmental stewardship, and resource conservation.

He was the lead organizer for Chicago's first-ever Open Streets event, is co-chair of the Open Streets Stakeholder Committee, sits on the Mayor's Pedestrian Advisory Council, serves on the board of directors for the Alliance for Biking and Walking, and also served on Mayoral Emanuel's Transportation and Infrastructure Transition Committee.
