CAS Intermediate-Level Language Competency Exam	This is one option for students who need to fulfill the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), School of Environmental Sustainability (SES), or School of Communication (SOC) foreign language graduation requirement. The competency exam is coordinated by CAS, SES, and SOC. Not all students must take this exam. To meet the foreign language requirement, one of the following is necessary: -Score a 4 or higher on a high school Advanced Placement foreign language test, or score a 4 or higher on a high school Advanced Placement foreign language literature testTake one foreign language course at the 102 level or higher and complete it with a C- or abovePass the CAS/SES/SOC language competency exam.
