

# Sociology - Anthropology Major

This combined B.A. degree is designed for those students who are interested in both Sociology and Anthropology. It focuses on those areas of the two disciplines where there is convergence in theory and methods. Through this major, students are introduced to major substantive areas in both disciplines. This major is particularly recommended for those who may seek jobs teaching in secondary schools or in community colleges.

Students who major in Sociology and Anthropology are required to take 13 courses, totaling 39 credit hours. The chart below outlines the requirements for this major.
