| Historical Knowledge | History |

| Literary Knowledge and Experience | Literature |
| Six credit hours—Demonstrate knowledge and experience in literary traditions and expressions | ENGL 1713, 1853; FREN 2933; SPAN 2913, 2923 |
| Quantitative Analysis | Mathematics |
| Three credit hours—Understand and analyze quantitative information presented in various formats | MATH 1713, 1774, 1833, 1853, 2515, 2523, 2535, 2613 COSC 2143, 2262, 2513, 2613; PHIL 2533 |
| Scientific Literacy | Natural Science |
| Six credit hours—Understand the basic principles, concepts and knowledge of the sciences and understand the methodology of scientific inquiry (Note: PSYC 1813 can satisfy either Scientific Literacy or Societal and Cultural Understanding.) | BIOL 1514, 1524, 1554, 1584, 1614, 1714, 2644, 2654, 2714 CHEM 1514, 1524, 2714, 2724 PHYS 1514, 1524, 2614, 2624 PSYC 1813 |
| Societal and Cultural Understanding | Social Science |
| Six credit hours—Understand belief, rituals and values of cultures; political, economic and social systems; and cultural/social forms of expressions | ECON 1553, 1563; PLSC 1513; PSYC 1813, 2513, 2773 SOCW 2523; SOCY 2513, 2523 |
| Philosophical Knowledge | Philosophy |
| Six credit hours—Understand influential philosophic questions, methods of inquiry; formulate and defend solutions to philosophic and ethical issues | PHIL 2513 (See <i>Ethics</i> below. If students take one ethics course and one philosophy course, they meet both areas.) |
| Ethics: Three credit hours —Demonstrate the ability to do ethical reflection and decision-making | PHIL 2523 |
| Theological and Religious Studies Knowledge | Theology |
| Six credit hours—Understand modes of inquiry and selected theological and religious systems | PHIL 2613 |
