Biographical History

Mary Patricia Haley, BVM was born on December 10, 1933 in Des Moines, Iowa. Sr. Mary Pat earned her B.A. at Clarke College in 1959 in English and her M.A. in English at the University of Iowa in 1967. She also earned a Ph.D. in Radio-TV-Film at Northwestern University in 1973. After teaching elementary and high school English for several years, in 1964, she accepted an Instructor of English position at Guadalupe College in California. Two years later, she joined the faculty of Mundelein College and taught in the Communications Department. Sr. Mary Pat went on to become the chairperson of the department as well as the Academic Dean of Mundelein College. Throughout her tenure at Mundelein and then at Loyola University, she participated in numerous university committees, taught weekend college, received a number of awards and grants, and served on several boards of trustees. She was also active in serving her religious community through participation on committees and writing for *Salt*, the order's quarterly journal.

Scope and Content

This collection spans the years 1973 to 1994 in two series: Professional and Dissertation. The bulk of the papers relate to Sr. Mary Pat Haley's teaching and administrative career at Mundelein College. The collection is organized chronologically within each series.

This series contains materials relating to Sister Mary Pat Haley's presentations to faculty and staff (which she called "Short Speeches") and her participation on the Vision Committee of Mundelein College that prefaced its affiliation with Loyola University in 1991.
