Biographical Information

Carol Frances Jegen was born 11 October 1925 to Julian and Evelyn Jegen of Chicago. Her father ran Jegen's Florist on the Near North side for over fifty years and her mother, a graduate of the American Conservatory of Music, was a concert pianist and a singer. Although she was raised as a Catholic, as a child she was intensely aware of the divisions of Christian faith. Her mother was a Lutheran and her father a Catholic, a situation that probably contributed to her adult motivation to instigate interfaith cooperation. Despite her parents' religious differences, however, Catholicism obviously exercised a profound influence upon the Jegen children. Carol Frances officially joined the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on 8 September 1944, a little over a month before her nineteenth birthday. Two of her sisters joined other religious orders; her brother inherited the management of Jegen's Florist; and her other sister married and raised a family.

Sister Carol Frances has successfully combined spiritual and academic pursuits, having received her B.S. in History from St. Louis University in 1951, and both her M.A. in Theology in 1958 and her Ph.D. in Religious Studies in 1968 from Marquette University. When she received her Ph.D. in Religious Studies, she was one of a mere handful of women in the country to boast such an achievement, since theological Ph.D. programs that admitted women were still woefully few. In addition, she studied at St. John's University's Institute for Ecumenical and Cultural Research in Collegeville, Minnesota, during a sabbatical from Mundelein College, 1984-1985. Sister Carol Frances also enriched her personal knowledge by acting as a visiting professor in Christian

spirituality at Creighton University (1984, 1986) and as a visiting professor at the University of Notre Dame's Institute for Clergy Education (1979, 1982-1983).

Although Sister Carol Frances has taught at the elementary, secondary, and university levels, her identity as a scholar and an educator is most often associated with Mundelein College in Chicago. She joined the staff of Mundelein College, a distinguished Catholic women's institution, in 1957. She came to Mundelein during a time when for the first time, women in the Catholic Church were being allowed, even encouraged, to pursue studies in theology. Naturally, a young, ebullient woman of faith such as Sister Carol Frances vigorously pursued the new challenges available to her, dramatically influencing the development of Mundelein College in the process. As her education progressed, her determination to inculcate independent thought and self-worth into the young women under her instruction grew exponentially. Consequently, she was an instrumental faculty member at Mundelein University from 1957 to 1991, serving the university community as a Professor of Religious Studies (Associate Professor in 1969 and full Professor in 1972), Theology Department Chairwoman (1957-1964, 1968-1969, 1973), Chairperson of the Peace Studies Committee (1987-1991), coordinator of the Hispanic Institute (1979-1987, 1989-1991), and as the founder and subsequently, director of both Mundelein's Graduate Program in Religious Studies (1967-1977, 1979-1982) and the Mundelein Center for Religious Education (1966-1970).

After Mundelein College was absorbed into Loyola University of Chicago in 1991, Sister Carol Frances joined the Loyola community as a Professor of Pastoral Studies and as a consultant to the Instituto Hispanico. She also co-chaired a Peace Studies Committee at Loyola for the College of Arts and Sciences, which established a Peace Studies minor patterned after Mundelein College's model. Although she officially retired from Loyola in 1995, she has continued to teach an occasional class and to participate in campus events.

Sister Carol Frances has always been dedicated to translating her convictions into actions. She has long been active in women's issues, particularly those that involve women and Catholicism. She has also devoted much of her energies to the support of Hispanic ministries, work that has earned her an ACP (Association of Chicago Priests) Award and the Loyola University of Chicago Civic Award. She is probably best known, however, for her unfailing support of the United Farm Workers Movement. She was even incarcerated for two weeks in a Fresno prison camp for her involvement, an experience that only served to strengthen her dedication to the farm workers' plight. This experience inspired Sister Carol Frances to campaign vigorously on behalf of U.F.W. boycotts and to encourage her fellow B.V.M. sisters to support the cause. Sister Jegen was one of the first Catholics to become actively involved in civil disobedience, and her courage and conviction paved the way for other Catholic religious figures to become passive dissenters.

Scope and Content

The papers of Sister Carol Frances Jegen, B.V.M., spanning 1961 to 1996, focus primarily on her work as an academic and as an educator, first at Mundelein College and then at Loyola University of Chicago. Her work as a social activist is also well documented; documents detailing her work with the United Farm Workers Union are particularly instructive. The Jegen Papers include

awards, documents regarding associations, meetings, and conferences, books, articles, and book reviews. Personal and professional correspondences are also included, as well as several Curriculum Vitae.

Series 1, Biographical and Personal, 1973-1995, Box 1, contains curriculum vitae, papers relating to her work with the United Farm Workers, and personal correspondence from friends, family, members of the clergy, and former students. Correspondents include Cesar Chavez, Joseph Cardinal Bernadin, Bishop Thomas J. Gumbleton, Sr. Helen Maher Garvey, B.V.M., Rabbi Herman E. Schaalman and Sr. Ann Ida Gannon, B.V.M.

Series 2, Awards, 1977-1986, Box 1, encompasses documentation of awards presented to Sr. Jegen, speeches made in her honor, and her acceptance speeches. Congratulatory personal correspondence and newspaper/magazine clippings regarding awards ceremonies are also included. Among these awards is an Honorary Doctorate from St. Mary of the Woods College (1977), the Loyola University of Chicago Civic Award (1981), and the Immaculata Alumnae Association Mary Francis Clark award (1986).

Series 3, Lectures, 1978-1995, Boxes 1-3, includes numerous lectures regarding the Virgin Mary; major addresses to the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (B.V.M.); and parish, diocesan, and national lectures pertaining to an array of Catholic issues. These lectures took place at such locations as Spertus College of Judaica, St. Mary's College, Urbana, IL, Cleveland, OH, and Sacramento, CA, and included lecture series such as the Gaudete Lecture at Holy Name Cathedral, Chicago, IL.

Series 4, Associations, Meetings, Conferences, 1961-1989, Boxes 3-4, is composed of diverse documents, including files pertaining to Mundelein College's Department of Theology and Graduate Program in Religious Studies (1961-1993) and various causes Sr. Jegen works for. Among these causes are the U.S. Catholic Bishops' Advisory Council (1969-1974), the Chicago Archdiocesan Justice/Peace Office (1980-1983), the Vatican II Symposium (1983), the CONCILIUM Statement (1968), the CPC Latin American/Caribbean Peace Conference (1987), and the "Toward a Theology of Peace" Conference (1987). Sr. Jegen was also involved with the Catholic Commission on Intellectual and Cultural Affairs (1989).

Series 5, Books, 1985-1989, Box 4, features documents regarding books either written, co-written, or edited by Sr. Carol Francis Jegen. Included are materials pertaining to *Mary According to Women*, *Jesus the Peacemaker*, *Restoring Our Friendship with God*, and *Thank God*.

Series 6, Articles, 1961-1996, Boxes 4-6, is comprised of articles for national and Chicago-area periodicals, chapters in books, and related papers. Periodicals frequently cited are: *Chicago Studies*, *Worship*, *The Bible Today*, *Liturgy*, and *Lutheran Women Today*.

Series 7, Book Reviews, 1985-1995, Box 6, consists of several reviews of books solicited from various periodicals or publishers. The books reviewed primarily examined some aspect of Mary and/or her role in the Roman Catholic Church.

Series 8, Audio-Visual Materials, n.d., Box 7, consists of photographs, slides, and cassettes of events in which Sister Carol Frances Jegen, BVM took part. This series includes photographs and slides of the United Farm Workers.

Series 9, Publications, 1961-1994, n.d., Box 8, consists of writing by Sister Carol Frances Jegen, BVM, in their final published form.
