Administrative History

In 1997, the Gannon Center for Women and Leadership of Loyola University Chicago sponsored the creation of a collection of historical essays about Mundelein College, the last four-year women's college in Illinois. The school, founded by the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, lasted sixty-one years, from 1930 to 1991. The co-directors of the book project included Sr. Ann Harrington, BVM and Prudence Moylan and other participating members included Paula Pfeffer, Sr. Joan Frances Crowley, BVM, Sr. Mary DeCock, BVM, and Sr. Carolyn Farrell, BVM.

Scope and Content

This collection spans from 1997 to 2002 with some undated material. The bulk of the records relate to the creation of the book including contracts, authors, publication, research, and publicity.

Additional material includes limited audio-visuals: photographs, video and audio recording of a book discussion held at Loyola University Chicago. The materials are organized alphabetically.

Series 1: Administration, 1997-2002, n.d., Box 1

Contains materials the bulk of the collection materials including contracts, authors, publication, research, contracts, drafts, research, and publicity.
