Biographical/Administrative History

Dr. Susan A. Ross received her B.A. in 1972 from Manhattanville College in New York and earned her M.A. in 1976 and her Ph.D. in 1982 from the University of Chicago Divinity School. Dr. Ross taught theology at St. Norbert College from 1980 until 1983 and at Duquesne University from 1983 until 1985 before moving to her current position at Loyola University Chicago. At Loyola, Dr. Ross became a full professor in the theology department in 2002 and the director of the Ann Ida Gannon, BVM, Center for Women and Leadership in 2006. In addition to teaching classes in the graduate and undergraduate theology programs, Dr. Ross also teaches in the Women's Studies Program, the Institute of Pastoral Studies, and the Catholic Studies Program. Dr. Ross has published numerous articles, chapters, and book reviews regarding theology, particularly on topics that include women and the Eucharist, embodiment, feminist theology, and feminist ethics. She also published *Extravagant Affections: A Feminist Sacramental Theology* in 1998 and *For the Beauty of the Earth: Women, Sacramentality, and Justice* in 2006 and co-edited *Broken and Whole: Essays on Religion and the Body* with Maureen A. Tilley in 1995. Dr. Ross' expertise in feminist theology has been recognized throughout the theology profession as she has been invited to present lectures and presentations at numerous institutions, conferences, and workshops. She also received the College Theology Society Book of the Year Award in 1999, the Ann O'Hara Graff Award from the Women's Seminar of the Catholic Theological Society of America in 2001, and an Honorable Mention for Best Gender Issues Book from the Catholic Press Association in 2007.

Scope and Content

The Susan A. Ross, Ph.D., Papers span the years 1976-2006 and include materials related to Dr. Ross' professional work as a feminist theologian. The records consist of Dr. Ross' various lectures,

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presentations, workshops, and papers regarding feminist theology. The materials are arranged chronologically and located in one box.
