Administrative History

The origins of the Women's Studies Program at Loyola University Chicago date back to the 1977-1978 academic year when four faculty members, Dr. Suzanne Gossett, Dr. Randa Dubnick, Dr. Judith Wittner, and Dr. Susan Kerstein, were awarded a Mellon Foundation Grant. This grant enabled the women to explore the possibilities of establishing a comprehensive women's studies program that would address the needs of a changing university and a rapidly growing discipline. Women's studies as a field was becoming more influential at this time as the National Women's Studies Association was established in 1977 and more universities were developing programs in this area. In June 1978, the Women's Studies Planning Committee, consisting of Dr. Randa Dubnick, Dr. Suzanne Gossett, and Dr. Judith Wittner, submitted a proposal for the establishment of a Women's Studies Program at Loyola. The proposal was approved during the 1978-1979 academic year, and the program officially began in the fall of 1979, making it the first of its kind at a Jesuit institution.

The Women's Studies Program at Loyola initially began as an undergraduate minor for students interested in the discipline. The program expanded in 1999 and can now be taken as a second undergraduate major. A comprehensive graduate program component was added to the department under the direction of Dr. Pamela Caughie, the director of the Women's Studies Program at that time, with the first graduate students in women's studies enrolling in the fall of 1999. Students can

pursue a Masters of Arts degree or a certificate in women's studies. In addition, students enrolled in other graduate programs at Loyola can obtain a concentration in women's studies. In 2002, a dual-degree program was developed with the social work department, allowing graduate students to earn both a Masters of Arts degree in women's studies and a Masters of Social Work degree through the course of a three-year program. The Women's Studies Program has expanded its focus on women's issues to include gender issues and continues to offer more diverse courses to its students. In recognition of these developments within its own department and the discipline at large, the Women's Studies Program changed its name to the Women's Studies and Gender Studies Program in the 2008-2009 academic year.

While the core of the Women's Studies Program remains its courses, which explore the intersections of women, gender, and sexuality through the lenses of diverse academic disciplines, it also has offered additional avenues of involvement for the Loyola University population. The program has sponsored numerous special events, seminars, and workshops throughout its history, hosting writers, artists, performers, and scholars, such as Alice Walker, Gloria Steinem, bell hooks, Sheila Tobias, and Barbara Ehrenreich.

Included in the records of the Women's Studies Program are the selected records of the Loyola Women's Center. While not directly associated with the academic program, the activities of the organization often paralleled the concerns of the department. The members of this group hosted events related to women's issues and rallied for gender equality on Loyola's campus. In addition to the Loyola Women's Center, several attempts were made by women's studies faculty to develop a research center for women and gender on campus. The creation of the Ann Ida Gannon, BVM, Center for Women and Leadership, which was conceived as a result of the affiliation of Mundelein College and Loyola University Chicago, has served in this capacity since 1993. Also included in the Women's Studies Program records are materials related to the Commission on the Status of Women, a group of women employees at Loyola who were invited by President Fr. Michael Garanzini, S.J. to look at the experiences of women at Loyola. The commission conducted its work between 2005 and 2006 and delivered to the President a summary of their findings and recommendations on how to improve the status of women at the university.

Scope and Content

The Women's Studies Program Records consist of items related to the development, administration, and programming of the Women's Studies Program at Loyola University Chicago. The records range from 1977 until 2007 and include correspondence, meeting minutes, newsletters, programming materials, flyers, and newspaper articles. The audio/visual materials include photographs and video tapes of women's studies faculty and events. The materials are divided into five series and arranged chronologically within each series.

Series 1: Administrative Records, 1977-2007, n.d., Boxes 1-7

This series contains the administrative materials related to the development of Loyola's Women's Studies Program during its first 25 years. The items include correspondence and materials related to the various directors of the Women's Studies Program, program proposals and descriptions, faculty activities and research, meeting minutes, brochures, newsletters, and newspaper articles related to women's studies activities at Loyola. Also included in this series are materials pertaining

to the development of a graduate program in women's studies and various evaluations and annual reports of the Women's Studies Program.

Subseries 1A: Loyola Women's Center, 1977-1994, n.d., Boxes 6-7

Materials in this subseries relate to the Loyola Women's Center, an organization founded in conjunction with the Women's Studies Program to serve as a center for research and discussion among students and faculty interested in women's studies and gender issues at Loyola University. The items include meeting minutes, flyers, newsletters, publications, and materials from Women's Centers at other institutions.

Series 2: Course Material, 1977-2007, n.d., Boxes 7-9

This series consists of items needed for course development and scheduling within the Women's Studies Program at Loyola, including syllabi, correspondence, course descriptions and schedules, evaluations, and enrollment statistics.

Series 3: Special Events and Programs, 1977-2007, n.d., Boxes 9-14

This series contains materials related to special events and programs planned and put on by the Women's Studies Program. The items include flyers, events calendars, correspondence, and other planning materials. In addition to programs for students and the public, this series also contains materials related to faculty workshops and seminars developed by the department.

Series 4: Commission on the Status of Women, 1987-2006, n.d., Boxes 14-15

The Commission on the Status of Women was an initiative from Loyola President Fr. Michael Garanzini, S.J. in 2005 to examine the status of women at Loyola and determine how the experiences of women could be enhanced at the university. This series is composed of materials from that commission. Items include meeting minutes, correspondence, survey data, articles on gender equity issues in academia, and examples of similar studies conducted at other institutions.

Series 5: Audio/Visual Materials, 1979-2006, n.d., Boxes 15-18

This series contains audio/visual materials related to the Women's Studies Program at Loyola. The items include photographs and video tape recordings taken at events sponsored by the Women's Studies Program.
