Administrative History

These records reflect mainly the work of Alice Bourke Hayes, Ph.D., who served as the Associate Academic Vice President from September 1st, 1980, to June 5th, 1987, after she served as Dean of Natural Science and before her appointment to the newly created role of Vice of President for Academic Affairs in 1987. The office of the Vice-President for Academic Affairs is now the office of the Provost.

Scope and Content

The records of Associate Academic Vice President Alice Bourke Hayes span the years 1976-1983 and consists of 2.0 linear feet. The collection includes correspondence, affirmative action targets and evaluations, undergraduate studies catalogs, committee reports, event proposals and schedules, and documents relating to Mellon Foundation grants.

Series

Series 1: Correspondence, 1980-1982. Box 1

This series contains correspondence relating to the Loyola-Mellon grants, the process, construction, and publishing of the undergraduate studies catalog, the affirmative action program at Loyola University Chicago, and special events funded by the university.

Series 2: Affirmative Action, 1979-1982. Boxes 1-2

This series contains guidelines for hiring, targets for university departments, reports from the departments on minority faculty and open positions, and analyses of ethnic compositions of the departments.

Series 3: Academic Priorities Committee, 1976-1977. Box 2

This series contains a general report from the Academic Priorities Committee for Loyola University Chicago, as well as three-year plans from different departments and offices at the university.

Series 4: Undergraduate Studies Catalog, 1980-1982. Box 2

This series contains the undergraduate studies catalogs for the academic years 1980-1981 and 1981-1982, listing courses and containing course descriptions.

Series 5: Special Events, 1980-1981. Box 2

This series contains forms for special event funding, listings of special events funded and hosted by Loyola University Chicago, calendars of the special event schedule, evaluations of funded events, proposals rejected for funding, and proposals accepted from academic departments.

Series 6: Mellon Grants, 1979-1983. Box 2-3

This series contains general forms for Mellon grant applications, guidelines for usage of the grant, budget and expense reports, check requisition forms and copies from Mellon grant-sponsored events, schedules of events sponsored by the Mellon grant, instructions for essay contests sponsored by the Mellon grant, and descriptions and reports from Mellon grant-sponsored events. There are also documents relating to the Matteo Ricci Symposium, also referred to as the China-Jesuit Symposium.

Series 7: Restricted, 1980-1982. Box 4

This series contains check requisitions, budget reports, and change of grade requests.
