Administrative History

From 1980 until her appointment on 5 June 1987 to the newly created position of Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dr. Hayes served as Associate Academic Vice President. It was primarily as Associate Academic Vice President that the following series of records were created.

Scope and Content

The Vice President for Academic Affairs, Alice Bourke Hayes, Ph.D., records span the years 1973 to 1987 and consist of grant proposals and reports, correspondence, minutes, memos, and reports.

Series

SERIES 1: LOYOLA-MELLON GRANTS, 1973-1987. Boxes 1 - 2

Mellon Foundation grant funds for the purpose "of strengthening the influence of liberal arts studies in the curricula" first became available at Loyola in 1973. Proposals were invited from the Loyola community and reviewed by a committee to determine which applications fit most clearly into the terms of the Loyola-Mellon grant. The criteria for selection varied through the years (see folder 1-1 below). During the first three to four years the grant was administered by Vice President and Dean of Faculties Richard A. Matre. Thereafter, James D. Barry was given responsibility, first as Associate Vice President for Academic Programs and Research and later as acting Vice President and



Dean of Faculties. Beginning in 1980, responsibility was transferred to Associate Academic Vice President Alice B. Hayes, Ph.D., who was administrator for the grants found in this series.

The grants in this series were funded in 1985-1986, primarily Fall Series #22, though the records span the dates from 1973 to 1987. The grants are arranged in numerical order with "Special Events" grants placed at the end. Information in brackets was not on the original file folder.

SERIES 2: STANDING COMMITTEES, 1974, 1983-1987. Boxes 2-3

This series relates primarily to the concerns of University standing committees and to standing committee appointments made by Senior Vice President and Dean of Faculties Ronald E. Walker, Ph.D., who was assisted by Associate Academic Vice President Alice B. Hayes, Ph.D. Responsibility for some appointments was also held jointly with Medical Center Provost and Chief Administrator Richard A. Matre, Ph.D.

This series is divided into three subseries, each representing an academic year. These subseries are composed primarily of committee lists, committee membership recommendations, letters of appointment, reports, statistics, committee charges, memoranda, correspondence, and minutes. General files are followed by files of specific standing committees, arranged generally by key word. Most minutes have been removed and placed with the records of the corresponding standing committee in the University Archives.
