#### **Biographical Sketch**

Margaret M. Dagenais was born on January 20, 1922, in Montreal, Canada, and later became a United States citizen. She received a Bachelor of Education degree from Chicago Teachers College in 1942 and taught at Mercy High School, Chicago, and Cardinal Stritch College, Milwaukee before beginning as a part-time instructor at Loyola University Chicago in 1950. After receiving her B.A.E. from the Art Institute of Chicago in 1952, she became a full-time faculty member at Loyola, and in 1953 she received her M.A.E. from the Art Institute of Chicago. Ms. Dagenais was Director of the Fine Arts Program in the Department of Education from 1965 until 1969, when she founded the Fine Arts Department. She served as the chair of the Fine Arts Department until 1974. Dagenais was granted the rank of Full Professor in 1971 and continued to teach at Loyola until her death in 1983.

Ms. Dagenais was a multi-talented artist who produced a large number of stone sculptures, cast aluminum figures, mosaics, mixed media works, and oil paintings. Many of her works were liturgical in nature, including works at the Cook County Jail Chapel (Chicago, IL), St. Timothy's Church (Chicago, IL), and St. Pascal's Parish (Chicago, IL); cast aluminum sculptures for St. Michael's Monastery (Oyama, Japan); a seven foot stone sculpture of St. Ignatius Loyola for Sheed and Ward (New York, NY); and two altars for the Carmelite Chapel (Aylesford, IL). She also worked in calligraphy and designed greeting cards as well as many back covers of <u>Today</u> magazine. Her single artist shows included "In Fragments" (1973), "Mask" (1976), and "Messages" (1981). These shows were held at Loyola University (Chicago, IL). "In Fragments" was also exhibited at Cardinal Stritch College (Milwaukee, WI).

## **Scope and Content**

The Margaret M. Dagenais papers comprise 1.0 liner foot spanning the years 1937 to 1984 (mostly undated) and includes correspondence, diplomas, articles, calligraphy, cards, photographs, and slides. The photographs and slides are arranged according to art shows, location of artwork, and title of artwork.
