### **Biographical Sketch**

Jean Delanglez, S.J., was born Mouscron, Belgium on January 14, 1896, the son of Jean-Baphiste and Marie-Louise (Deinze) Delanglez, and entered the New Orleans Province of the Society of Jesus at Macon, Georgia, on August 31, 1921. He completed his novitiate in 1923 and was sent to Grand Coteau, Louisiana to review his college studies. From 1924 to 1927 he followed the Jesuit program in philosophy courses for a Master of Arts degree at Mount St. Michael's, outside of Spokane, Washington. In 1928 he was sent to Dublin, Ireland, for theological studies at Milltown Park. Following his ordination on July 31, 1931, he began his doctoral studies in history at The Catholic University of America, where he studied under Dr. Peter Guilday. Delanglez received his Ph.D. on June 9, 1935, specializing in New France and the role of the Jesuits in the discovery and settlement of the Mississippi valley. In 1936 he was assigned to full-time research at the Institute of Jesuit History at Loyola University Chicago. Among his numerous books and articles are *The French Jesuits in Lower Louisiana*, 1700-1763 (1935), Some La Salle Journeys (1938), The Journal of Jean Cavelier (1939), Frontenac and the Jesuits (1940), and Life and Voyages of Louis Jolliet (1645-1700) (1948).

Jean Delanglez, S.J., passed away on May 9, 1949, at Loyola University Chicago.

# **Scope and Content**

The Delanglez papers span the years 1931 to 1949, and consist of correspondence, research notes, speeches, telegrams, reprints, newspaper clippings, manuscripts, publications, book reviews, photographs, and photo static copies of maps. Materials are in English, French, Latin, and shorthand. Subjects include Gilbert J. Garraghan, S.J.; Samuel Knox Wilson, S.J.; Canada; Louis Joliet (spelt Jolliet in the notes); Jesuit Martyrs; American Catholicism; Louisiana; and colonial French North America.

Contains research notes, translations, and photo static copies of maps relating to Delanglez's work on colonial French North America [New France]. Subjects include Louisiana, Canada, Louis Joliet, Beaubois, Taschereau, Jesuit Martyrs, and Quebec. Materials are in English, French, and shorthand.
