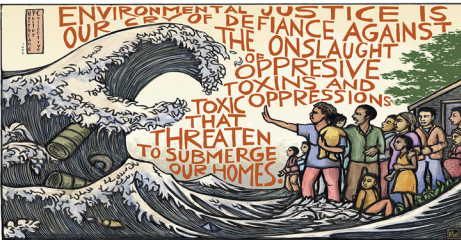


**Father Stu Screening with Featured Guest Mark Wahlberg**

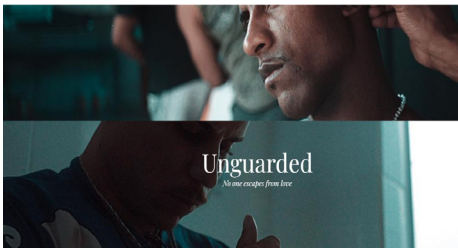

Viewing and Discussion

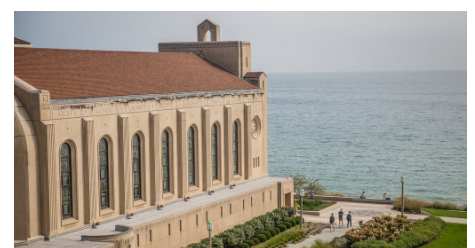
