4. Minimum of two years' teaching experience on teacher certificate
5. Provides transcripts from all colleges and universities
6. G.P.A 3.0/4.0
7. Three (3) letters of recommendation (one from current principal)
8. Personal Statement focusing on transformational leadership and social justice
9. Current resume'

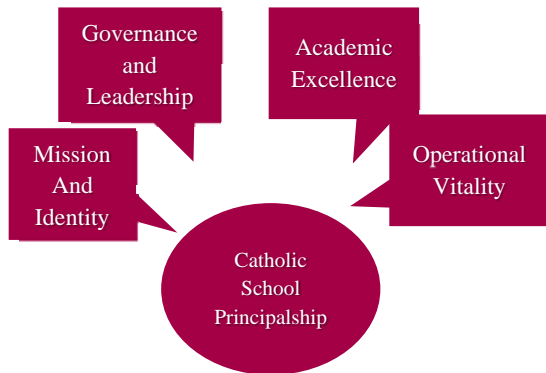
