Collaboration Reading Assignments

As part of our project, and in order to foster both interdisciplinary and intercultural dialogue, we have asked each of you to read and comment on the DCCIRP papers of three (3) of your colleagues. As you continue to work on your papers, we would like to inform you of two important dates to keep in mind with regard to this peer review process:

1 March 2011:

This is the **final due date for submitting** your paper to the Wiki space for peer review. I will explain the submission process below.

1 May 2011:

This is the **final due date for returning your comments** on each of the three papers to their respective authors. Returning comments earlier than this date (especially for our Lithuanian colleagues and US colleagues traveling to the Regional Colloquia in Lithuania) is strongly encouraged.

In order to submit your paper for review, you will need to sign onto the Wiki page and post your paper as an attachment. On the 'Home' page of the DCCIRP Wiki space, click on the 'Tools' link in the upper right hand corner of the screen and select 'Attachments' from the pull down menu. From here it is a simple process of uploading to the Wiki space.

The March date was selected in order to give each of you another five months to put together a working draft of your paper. On 1 March 2011, we do ask that you submit your paper for review in whatever form your paper is in at that time.

The May date was selected in order to give you three weeks per paper to read and review. We ask that if you are reading and reviewing a paper for one of your Lithuanian colleagues – or one of your US colleagues traveling to the Lithuania conference – to read and review this paper first, so that it will give each author time to review your comments and incorporate them into their colloquium presentation in May.

A word on the reading and review process. While three weeks is a quick turn-around time for reading and reviewing a paper, we want to inform you that we are not looking for each of you to read and review these papers as you might for a journal or similar academic outlet. This reading and review process should be more on the ‘light’ side. Be conscientious, critical and constructive, of course, but treat this stage of the review process as if you were reading a paper or chapter of a colleague or doctoral student who is primarily looking for initial reactions, feedback, and any additional resource suggestions. This should make the three weeks per paper process more manageable.

As for returning your paper comments to each author, we recommend – given the distance between some participants – that you use e-mail (however, if you prefer a different method of communication, that is acceptable as well). An excel file with all the e-mail addresses of participating scholars has been attached to the wiki space. You can access this document and the e-mail addresses of your colleagues from there.
