At the School of Education (SOE), we offer:

- **PARTNERSHIPS WITH LOCAL SCHOOLS AND CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS** We partner with PK–12 public and Catholic schools in the Chicago area, allowing us to place you in a real classroom starting in your first year. SOE also has special partnerships with local cultural institutions that you will work with throughout your program. Some of these institutions include Adler Planetarium, Field Museum, Chicago History Museum, and Shedd Aquarium.
- **LICENSURE** Our teacher preparation programs support you in obtaining the Professional Educator License (PEL), enabling you to teach in Illinois and pursue licensure in the other states with reciprocity agreements. Graduating with a BSEd from Loyola also provides you with a full year internship experience and eligibility for an ESL endorsement. Additionally, many of our licensure programs qualify for a teacher certificate through the International Baccalaureate Organization.
- **STUDY ABROAD** SOE students can participate in various study abroad programs, where you can experience teaching and learning in a different country. If you like to travel, a teaching degree also puts you in a good position to teach English in schools across the world.
- **INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING** Interdisciplinary learning lets you explore multiple fields and broadens your perspective. As part of the Core Curriculum, you'll take classes in art, history, math, science, philosophy, and more.
- **HIGH PLACEMENT** Our graduates are in high demand, and education jobs are abundant. 99% of SOE graduates are employed within three months of graduation.
