



AWARDS FOR STUDENTS INTERESTED IN LEADERSHIP, PUBLIC POLICY, AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Truman Scholarship: Juniors interested in pursuing a graduate degree and career in public service, from any related academic field, can apply. You must have both excellent academic merit and a demonstrated record of community service. The award provides up to \$30,000 for Master's level study. The campus deadline is in December; institutional deadline is in February. www.truman.gov

Boren Scholarships: Enrolled undergraduates can apply for \$8000 for the summer, \$10,000 for a semester or \$20,000 for a year of study abroad in countries outside of Western Europe, Canada, Australia and New Zealand. There is a government service requirement following completion of the degree. The campus deadline is in December; institutional deadline is in February. www.borenawards.org

Davis-Putter Scholarship Program: This program provides up to \$10,000 to enrolled students involved in "active participation in struggles for civil rights, economic justice, international solidarity or other progressive issues." It is also a need-based award, although the most important criteria are the student's academic potential and demonstrated leadership in social change. The deadline is April 1. <http://www.davisputter.org/>

Public Policy & International Affairs Fellowship Program: Juniors and seniors can apply for this program that provides summer service opportunities in Washington, DC and funding toward completion of a Master's Degree in Public Policy or Public Affairs. The award is particularly geared toward underrepresented students, although any student committed to public service can apply. The deadline is in November. <http://www.ppiaprogram.org/>

Rangel International Affairs Program: The Rangel program offers both a fully-funded Summer Enrichment Program for experiential learning in Washington, D.C.; they also offer Graduate Fellowships (tuition, fees & living stipend) for students interested in going into the Foreign Service. Deadline is the last week of September. <http://rangelprogram.org>

Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship Program: Also for students interested in going into the Foreign Service, the Undergraduate fellowship provides up to \$37,500 a year for two years, covering the senior year and first year of a Master's degree; the Graduate Fellowship provides up to \$37,500 per year for two years of a Master's degree. Both fellowships include two summer internships: the first in Washington D.C., and the second overseas at a U.S. Embassy or consulate. Payne International Development Fellowship: For students interested in going into either the Foreign Service or the USAID, this award provides up to \$93,000 over two years for a Master's degree and a direct pathway to the USFS or USAID. The deadline is in January. <https://www.paynefellows.org/>
