THROUGH LOYOLA'S FINANCIAL AID OFFICE

Visit LUC.edu/finaid to learn more about your financial aid options, including loans and student employment. Your first step in the process is to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.ed.gov. We encourage you to submit your FAFSA at least 6–8 weeks before the start of your planned entry term. Loyola's federal school code is 001710.

Please note that international students are not eligible for federal financial aid.

THROUGH THE INSTITUTE OF PASTORAL STUDIES

The Institute of Pastoral Studies has limited funds available for financial assistance. Financial aid from Loyola's Financial Aid Office will not impact your ability to apply for financial aid through the Institute of Pastoral Studies, but may be adjusted based on those awards. Options include:
