ONLINE MASTER OF LAWS (LLM) IN HEALTH LAW

The Master of Laws (LLM) degree is an advanced graduate law program that allows domestic and international graduates holding a Juris Doctor (JD) degree, or its equivalent, to continue concentrated study in various fields of the law.

The LLM in Health Law focuses on the legal, regulatory, political, ethical, and economic realities of health care delivery, particularly in the areas of corporate transactions, compliance, health care finance, and government health policy.

### PROGRAM DETAILS

Loyola's School of Law offers the LLM in Health Law online, and at its Water Tower Campus in Chicago.

**LENGTH OF PROGRAM:** The campus LLM in Health Law can be completed in 1 year on a full-time basis, or 2 years on a part-time basis. The online LLM in Health Law can be completed in 2 years on a part-time basis. Both the campus and online programs require 24 hours of coursework, including drafting a paper of publishable quality on an approved health law topic.

**ACCELERATED OPTION:** Under the accelerated option, LLM degree candidates are required to complete 18 credit hours of study. The accelerated option is only available to those who have completed coursework at Loyola's School of Law as JD students. **LOCATION:** The LLM in Health Law is offered at Loyola's Water Tower Campus or as an entirely online program. The online option is only available to attorneys who have a minimum of 3 years of legal and/or health care experience.

### APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- A completed online application available at [gpem.LUC.edu/apply](https://gpem.LUC.edu/apply)
- Official transcripts of all undergraduate and any graduate work; transcripts must verify completion of a bachelor's degree and a primary law degree (e.g., JD or LLB)
- One letter of recommendation from someone familiar with your career
- A one- to two-page statement of purpose
- A resume outlining your work experience, education, professional or academic achievements, or any information you believe is relevant for your application

The following documents are required, in addition to those listed above, for those who may fall into these categories:

- Either an official TOEFL or IELTS score report for international applicants. This requirement is waived for those who have completed a 4-year bachelor's or a master's degree program in the U.S. For those holding a non-U.S. bachelor's degree, applicants wishing to apply for a waiver must submit U.S. transcripts that show that they have also earned a U.S. master's degree. The language test is also waived for those who are from, or who have completed a bachelor's or master's degree at a recognized institution in, Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, or the United Kingdom, where the language of instruction is English.
- International applicants or U.S. residents who completed school abroad are required to submit non-U.S. transcripts to one of the following: Educational Perspectives ([edperspective.org](http://edperspective.org)), Educational Credential Evaluators ([ece.org](http://ece.org)), or the Law School Admission Council ([lsac.org](http://lsac.org)) for evaluation of credentials. The general evaluation report must show that an applicant's non-U.S. education is equivalent to a U.S. bachelor's degree to be considered for admission.

#### APPLICATION DEADLINES

Loyola accepts applications for the campus LLM program for the fall term. The deadline is July 1.

Deadlines for the online LLM program are:

Fall Term: August 1

Spring Term: December 1

Summer Term: April 1
