The Bachelor of Arts in Management is designed to prepare you to excel as a valued and effective manager in today's complex work environments. Skilled managers should be well-rounded leaders with strong strategic planning and decision-making abilities, a solid understanding of business principles, and the ability to communicate effectively.

After completing the BA in Management, you will have four courses waived from your Quinlan School of Business MBA, should you pursue admission to that program.

Graduates of this program will:

- Apply critical thinking and problem-solving skills to solve common workplace issues
- Gain increased insight into how an individual's work experiences contribute to an organization as a whole
- Demonstrate a working knowledge of common business applications, effective communication, team building, and ethical leadership skills
- Impact organizational goals through effective project management strategies
- Apply an understanding of budgets, law, and data to managerial decision making

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

CURRICULUM

Courses provide you with a foundation in management principles and applications, critical thinking, and the ethical fundamentals to make sound judgements.

You will also complete three courses focused on personal and professional development, designed specifically for adult learners.

Courses are offered in an accelerated 8-week format with flexible evening, weekend, and online classes.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Loyola can accept 64 credits from a 2-year institution, including half of the major requirements. Transfer students must complete a minimum of 45 credits at Loyola.

CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING

Not all learning takes place inside a classroom. Adult students can bring professional learning and accomplishments to the program. You can earn credit for experience-based learning for up to four courses in the major and up to 36 total credits. Pursuing non-traditional sources of credit offers opportunities to earn credit for knowledge gained through life experiences that qualify as college-level learning, providing substantial savings of time and tuition.
