APPLYING TO LOYOLA

- Complete your free application at gpem.LUC.edu/apply.
- A DNP degree is required for post-graduate certificate applicants.
- A BSN, MSN, or DNP degree is required for Oncology certificate applicants.
- Official transcripts of all undergraduate and any graduate work should accompany your application.
- Current RN license from a U.S. state and be eligible for endorsement in Illinois.
- Deadlines: **Fall Semester**

DNP Programs: July 1 (only admission period)

Certificate Programs: July 1

PhD Program: July 1 (only admission period)

Spring Semester
