SCHOLARSHIPS

Parkinson Scholars

Parkinson graduate students are eligible for the Robert and Betty Parkinson Scholar award, which honors the Parkinson's commitment to ensuring access to quality health care and recognizing that health care is a basic human right. Each recipient receives a tuition-restricted award and additional funds to support scholarly activity. Parkinson Scholars have the opportunity to engage in community service, leadership, research, and mentorship opportunities.

Student Support Grants

The Parkinson School promotes student wellness, personal and professional growth, and provides opportunities for funding and support resources throughout your studies. As you expand your academic research and leadership skills, you may be eligible to receive annual grants to support participation in local and national conference presentations.



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WHAT MAKES US STAND OUT?

Parkinson is a member of the **Institute for Translational Medicine (ITM)**. Funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the ITM is a group of institutions working to make clinical trials more accessible to local patients and expediting the time it takes to move research into practice. This offers Parkinson students a unique opportunity to contribute to improved health outcomes through cutting edge research and practice.

The **COVID Equity Response Collaborative: Loyola (CERCL)** is an interdisciplinary team of students and professionals working in partnership with community leaders and public health officials to improve health justice in our local communities most impacted by structural inequity.

Parkinson's **Center for Health Outcomes and Informatics Research (CHOIR)** engages faculty, health care professionals, physicians, and students in the fundamentals of health outcomes research and data-driven health care.

Parkinson's **Center for Health Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CHIE)** is a central hub for scholars, community partners, thought leaders, entrepreneurs, and students who are committed to reducing health inequities and improve health care delivery.
