What is a Poverty Simulation?

During this 3-hour simulation, participants will role-play the lives of families living in poverty and the many community agencies with which they must interact. The program is free.

Who Should Attend and Why?

This workshop is geared towards students who will be working with low-income families on a regular basis - future nurses, doctors, social workers, teachers healthcare administrators, just to name a few.

Faculty are encouraged to participate to determine how this simulation can be used within curricula.

Providers will come away with a better understanding of the impact of poverty on health and well-being and will be better equipped to holistically approach patient care.
