

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Security Awareness Training Program

Information Security Awareness Training Challenges

- Automated reminder failure within SANS tool
 - Reminders needed to be sent manually
 - Increased staff overhead
- Individuals refusing to cooperate/pushback
- Inaccuracies in data from Lawson
- Terminations/Leave
- New hire tracking
- High level of follow-up required by UISO/Compliance teams
- Communication consistency & clarity



Phishing Assessment Program

- Phish Assessment Objectives
 - Reduce risks
 - Verify training effectiveness
 - Self assess with teachable moments for clickers
 - Reduce clicks



2% Multi-Click Rate



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



O365 Email Migration



- April 12 All remaining ITS moved to Exchange Online (63 users)
- April 19 University Marketing and Communication moved to Exchange Online (22 people)
- May 10 University Libraries and School of Continuing and Professional Studies will migrate to Exchange Online (78 people)
- May 17 Cross-section of users from across campus (some include Retirees, Emeritus, Alumni, and others but not dept/group specific) (438 people)
- To date all moves have occurred with little to no disruption




