

HOTEL RESERVATIONS

The 2024 L. Edward Bryant, Jr. National Health Law Transactional Competition will take place in the Phillip H. Corboy Law Center, located at 25 E. Pearson St., Chicago, IL 60611 on March 22, 2024. The Law Center is located at Loyola's downtown campus, better known as the University's Water Tower Campus for its proximity to the Chicago Water Tower, just steps off Chicago's famed Magnificent Mile. TRANSPORTATION

Loyola University Chicago School of Law is located at 25 E. Pearson St., Chicago, Illinois 60611.

If you are driving, we recommend taking the Ohio Street Exit from Interstate 90/94 (Exit 50B). From there you can navigate most easily to your hotel by heading north on LaSalle Drive or State Street. Most hotels will have a parking garage but charge varied parking fees. Please note that you will encounter substantial traffic within a 30-mile radius of Chicago during the hours of 3:00 and 6:00 p.m., resulting in a longer than estimated travel time (an additional hour or more).

If you are flying, you may take a cab, uber, or Chicago's public transportation to your hotel. The Chicago Transit Authority ("CTA") (also known as the "El" because the trains operate on elevated platforms) operates train lines from both O'Hare and Midway Airports. Google Maps is an excellent source for step-by-step instructions of how to arrive at your hotel as it has a public transportation option when searching for directions, which includes all of the CTA's buses and trains. Note that Southwest Airlines only flies into Midway, but often has the best rates for travel to Chicago.

While in Chicago, most consider cabs or uber the most convenient way to get around town. Alternatively, the CTA offers an extensive network of buses and trains. The CTA offers per-ride, day, and weekend passes. For more information on public transportation, please visit the [CTA website](#).
