We publish articles covering a variety of children's legal rights issues and are the only journal in the country that exclusively addresses the legal needs of children.

What We Are Looking For:

We invite you to submit articles that critically examine racial disproportionality, disparity, and bias in the child welfare system. We are looking for submissions that address some aspect of racial disparity in child welfare, analyze the impacts on the rights of children of color and their families, propose needed reforms, and provide practical suggestions for advocates and practitioners seeking to create an equitable system for all families.

Submission Details

- ◆ Submissions should be previously unpublished, original pieces.
- ◆ All articles should be between 15-60 pages double spaced and contain footnote citations that conform to *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation*.
- ◆ Submissions from current law students will not be accepted.
- ◆ Submissions will be reviewed and accepted on a rolling basis for Volume 41 issues.
