Membership Eligibility

- Students must have completed a minimum of five courses taught in Italian language.
- Students must have earned at least a GPA of B+ in Italian courses and an overall GPA of at least 3.0

How to apply

Students must provide a letter in Italian stating:

- Your learning experience studying Italian and what you appreciate the most about the Italian culture.
- A list of Italian classes you have taken.

- Your GPA in Italian courses taken and your overall GPA.
- Your email and contact information
