Marcella Niehoff School of Nursing Belize Drive

Each spring, associate professor Judith Jennrich, PhD, RN, ACNP, CCRN, travels to Belize with Loyola nursing students and nurse practitioner students. These volunteers spend their time in the villages, hospitals, clinics, and schools performing vision testing, preschool screenings, and screening for lice. Loyola students also present health education seminars on topics including hygiene, dental care, self-esteem, hypertension, diabetes, and obesity while teaching about the importance of nutrition and exercise.

Proviso East School-Based Health Center

A decade ago, the Marcella Niehoff School of Nursing partnered with Proviso East High School to open the district's first in-house health center. The Proviso East School-Based Health Center provides easy access to health care services for students. The center's nutrition programs include education, counseling, weight loss guidance, healthy lunch groups, and junk food free zones where students can eat nutritional snacks. Programs are designed to enhance school performance, fight obesity, and improve the health of students. The programs also increase dietary variety and offer tips for healthy meals that students can share with their families.
