## MAJOR OR MINOR IN POLITICAL SCIENCE

**Political Science Major.** To graduate with a major in Political Science students must complete 33 hours of course work (11 courses) in the department or through transfer or advanced placement credit. All majors are required to take PLSC 100, 101 and 102, plus one upper-division (200- or 300-level) course from each of the discipline's four subfields: American Politics, Comparative Politics, International Relations, and Political Theory. The remaining four courses are elective and may be taken in any of the discipline's four subfields. Students must earn a grade of C- or better in a course for it to count toward the major.

**Political Science Minor.** To graduate with a minor in Political Science students must complete 18 hours of course work (6 courses) in the department or through transfer or advanced placement credit. All minors are required to take PLSC 100, 101 and 102. The remaining three courses are elective and may be taken in any of the discipline's four subfields: American Politics, Comparative Politics, International Relations, and Political Theory. Students must earn a grade of C- or better in a course for it to count toward the minor.

## SPECIAL OPPORTUNITIES IN POLITICAL SCIENCE

**Political Science Honors Seminar PLSC 395 (Spring Semester).** Do you wish to graduate with "honors" in Political Science? If your answer is "yes," you should apply for enrollment in the Political Science Honors Seminar which is offered each spring and open to students in their junior or senior years. Admission into the Honors Seminar requires a 3.5 GPA in Political Science (and overall) as well as the completion of seven Political Science classes (21 credit hours). The Honors Seminar does not count toward the 33 credit hours required for a Political Science major. **Chicago Internship PLSC 370 (Spring, Summer & Fall Semesters) Professors Alan Gitelson & Brian Endless.** This program allows students to earn course credit while gaining valuable professional experience as an intern in the Chicago area. Internship possibilities include positions with U.S. Congressmen and Senators, Illinois Legislators, political campaigns, international organizations, policy think-tanks, and city, state, and federal government agencies. Interns earn 3 or 6 credit hours by working in an internship position that is jointly agreed upon by the student and the internship coordinator. The intern also takes part in a special seminar that meets four times during the semester and keeps a journal and writes a research paper related to the internship experience. Students need the permission of the internship coordinator to register and must submit an application form. Due to the limited number of positions that are allotted to each university taking part in the New York conference, participation in the course involves a selection process based on GPA, seniority, and prior coursework and activities in international politics and international organizations, such as Loyola's Model UN Club.
