PREREQUISITES AND COURSE DESCRIPTION

Prerequisite: ACCT 400 or equivalent.

Topics include product costing and activity based costing concepts, development and analysis of information for short-run and long-run decision making, the impact of accounting information on divisional performance, cost estimation and cost-volume-profit analysis, segment analysis, budgeting concepts, and behavioral issues associated with accounting information.

Outcome: Develop and use managerial accounting information for operational and strategic decision making.

Yes, this is an on-line course, but that does not mean we do not interact and communicate on a regular basis. Please feel free to call or e-mail me with questions/comments about the course. ONLINE COURSE SPECIFIC INFORMATION

This course is managed exclusively online, which means that there will be no "face-to-face" meetings. You will need your computer to participate in synchronous online sessions and exams. On-line however does not mean disconnected and distant. Our class will be very interactive and hands on.

We have class sessions (see the schedule below) exactly like a traditional class. You will be able to view a whiteboard, ask questions and more, just like the traditional classroom, yet be at a location of your choice. The key is to have a reliable internet connection. I record all sessions. You can view the recorded session at your discretion. That said, there is a direct relationship to success in the class and attending sessions.

We are in class with a synchronous session approximately 2 to 3 hours, every Tuesday 6:00 to 9:00 PM CST. You are encouraged to log into the Zoom virtual classroom a few minutes before each class begins. If late for the login you will miss important class announcements and often exam suggestions. You will find the Zoom connection in our course Sakai account, third tab down. Immediately below is the Panopto tab where I will post recorded lectures.

Additional comments:

- Arrive to class on-time, have your textbook available, be attentive, prepared and plan to participate in class Q/A.

COURSE GRADING

Point Distribution:

 The exams cover text readings, homework assignments, and class discussions. All exams must be taken at the scheduled time. Exceptions to this policy must be negotiated in advance. - Exams are monitored via Zoom. How?
 - 1. Log into Zoom with your camera and microphone set to the 'on' position.
 - 2. Once all are verified, I will provide an exam password.
 - 3. With Zoom running you log into Connect to take the exam. The exam session is recorded via Zoom.
 - 4. Upon completing and submitting the exam, you log off of Zoom.
- Exams consist of multiple choice, matching and short answer response questions.
