Class Objective: The purpose of this course is to provide aspiring and established business owners with an understanding of the recurring legal issues at various stages in entrepreneurship. Comprehending these principles will assist business owners in better organizing their business structures and operations. The goal is to help increase a business' duration and profitability by implementing appropriate processes to reduce the potentially substantial costs associated with failing to apply proper attention to foreseeable commercial risks.

Reading Material: The LREB 445 class packet includes the cases that will be covered in class. Students should read and be prepared to discuss the cases assigned for each class session.

Grading: Grades are based on a 100-point scale. A student's final grade is determined by adding the results of the equally valued Mid-Term and Final examinations. Students are also eligible for up to five additional points for outstanding class participation.

Class Attendance and Participation: In addition to reading the weekly assigned cases, it is essential that students attend class. Through a combination of lecturing and meaningful, interactive class discussions, we will arrive at the applicable rules of law for each assigned case. The class sessions will clarify the legal principles of the assigned cases and place those principles into the context of the course outline.
