I was also involved in formatting event structure for the upcoming academic year, and I am incredibly excited to start funding outdoor, in-person events and tabling with the committee! Outside of Allocations, I took on a leadership role as the chair of Budget Review Committee, designating all of Student Government's internal funds for the upcoming year and pursuing initiatives such as equitable scholarships and fund reorganization.

I have also pursued many pieces of legislation this past year. Working with Senator Hannah Kwak, we produced *Racial Sensitivity and Cultural Competency Training* legislation to restructure Campus Safety training and ensure focus on racial sensitivity, cultural competency, transparency, and communication. As a result of that initiative, students can now view a comprehensive list of Campus Safety trainings on their webpage and will continue to see developments within their training program. Through my role on Governance committee, I wrote legislation to establish an Associate Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Officer to help continue SGLC's critical work surrounding inclusion and support for all students. I am also looking forward to providing a re-orientation program along with Senators Nanda and Brist for sophomore students to provide the resources we need to succeed as unconventional second years.

Looking ahead to this year, I am ready to continue working on racial justice initiatives, keeping student events safe and inclusive, and fully investing myself in the organization.
